**SUMMARY:** The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is proposing to revise the BLM's oil and gas leasing regulations. Among other things, the proposed rule would reflect provisions of the Inflation Reduction Act pertaining to royalty rates, rentals, and minimum bids, and would update the bonding requirements for leasing, development, and production. The proposed rule would also improve the BLM's leasing process to ensure proper stewardship of public lands and resources and would revise some operating requirements.


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
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


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
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








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



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


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
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
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






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
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


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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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


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
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





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


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
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


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
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
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
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
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
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


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
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
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


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


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


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
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
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
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
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



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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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


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
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

Why does the administration believe there is a need, only one year later, to deviate from the management plan they just approved and add more restrictions on development?

#### Questions from Rep. Grijalva

Question 1. Multiple studies, including the United States Geological Survey's 2018 report "Federal Lands Greenhouse Gas Emissions and Sequestration in the United States: Estimates for 2005-2014" and Ratledge et al.'s 2022 "Emissions from fossil fuels produced on US federal lands and waters present opportunities for climate mitigation" in Climatic Change, have found that fossil fuel extraction on public lands and waters account for approximately one-quarter of U.S. greenhouse gas emissions. What proportion of U.S. greenhouse gas emissions come from oil and gas produced on BLM-managed land?



Question 2. The Government Accountability Office's (GAO) 2019 report, "Bureau of Land Management Should Address Risks from Insufficient Bonds to Reclaim Wells," identified 2,294 idled wells that had not produced in over ten years and had not been reclaimed and were therefore at higher risk of becoming orphaned. At the time of the report, an idled well was defined as a well that has been nonoperational for at least seven years. This suggests the wells identified by GAO had been idled without being reclaimed for at least three years, raising concerns about compliance with the statutory requirement for timely reclamation. What is the process BLM undertakes to identify idled wells and enforce reclamation requirements, and how long does it typically take between identifying an idled well and complete reclamation of said well?



Question 3. The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act lowered the time a well can be considered temporarily abandoned before being designated as idle from seven years to four years if the operator cannot reasonably demonstrate that the well will have future beneficial use.

Under this new definition, how many idled wells are on ELM-managed lands?

Sara and Steve,

The Native Village of Kaktovik and its tribal members want to extend our warmest thank you for your decision following our February 13, 2023 Cooperative Agency meeting in Kaktovik and the letter sent to you both requesting to cancel the ITEK meeting on February 22, 2023. I want to apologize for not sending this sooner but it has taken some time for us to fully comprehend that we were listened to by you. Thank you for listening. It gives us hope that we can express our thoughts on the issues that need to be addressed by us under the SEIS process. As we have stated, we would rather address the apparent deficiencies with the EIS, and based on an email we received from Mr. Cohn on September 8, 2023 we understand them to be the four items listed below.

"The ongoing SEIS development process will address the two deficiencies identified in SO 3401 plus any additional specific resource related issue(s), set forth a revised range of alternatives, and facilitate the analysis of the following issues:

- 1. Revision of the Reasonably Foreseeable Development (RFD) scenario to allow for consideration of an alternative that considers less than 2,000 acres of surface development.
- 2. Conduct additional analysis related to foreign greenhouse gas emissions and consider any new information related to subsistence resources (e.g., fish, marine mammals, caribou) and subsistence use/access which may inform any reconsideration of compliance under Section 810 of the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act (ANILCA), and any other targeted resource.
- 3. A wider range of development outcomes related to the RFD scenario (considering impacts of less than 2,000 acres of surface development) while also reanalyzing other resources.
- 4. Reconsideration of lease stipulations and Required Operating Procedures (ROP) (including new potential mitigation measures) across alternatives based on revised RFD scenario and additional analysis"

We have been hopeful that our meetings would allow us to weigh in on these items, which is why we focused on them through our comments on the Lease Stipulations (LS) and Required Operating Procedures (ROP) in our February 13 meeting. As our comments and our letter clearly stated we felt the focus on ITEK was premature and overwhelming, while creating the appearance of cultural trespass of our homelands. None of the agenda items were focused on the items above but instead were designed to allow tribal people who have never stepped foot on the Coastal Plain to establish some sort of traditional knowledge. We were completely dumbfounded and caught off guard with this approach.

Now that the ITEK Workshop and future ITEK Working Group meetings have been cancelled, again thank you for doing this, we would like to have another G2G meeting to begin discussion on the four items above.

It is not until we better know what suggested changes the agencies are contemplating that we can begin to incorporate indigenous knowledge into the process. There is no blanket form of traditional and indigenous knowledge that we can provide at this point – our knowledge comes into play when we know the specifics of the changes being proposed. For instance, with regard to the four items listed above we have reviewed the LS and ROPs as identified in item 4 above. We have been hoping that we

could begin to discuss our proposed revisions to the LS' and ROPs by going through them at our meeting. We understand that the changes in items 2 – 4 may lead to new LS and ROPs but we feel that discussing our concerns with the existing ROPs will help inform us in how to respond to any new LS' and ROPs.

We would also like to discuss items 1 and 3 and how you calculated the gravel needs for the two RFD's presented in the EIS. We are familiar with development in and around Nuiqsut and into NPR-A through our involvement in the NPR-A Working Group, and through listening to the public meetings on projects, and also through downloading the EIS' and SEIS' and reviewing as they work through the process. We do not recall any discussions the 2,000 acres of gravel allocations for the Reasonably Foreseeable Development (RFD) scenario in the earlier EIS G2G meetings and now after reviewing the Draft Summary of 'Indigenous Traditional Ecological Knowledge (ITEK) Documented On Behalf Of Coastal Plain Oil & Gas Leasing Program In Cooperation With The Native Village Of Kaktovik' sent to us on February 13 it appears that we did not provide any comments on the RFD scenarios that were developed for the EIS. We would like you to understand that placement of gravel is important to us even if it is for a scenario for Leasing and we would like to be able to provide our comments on any and all potential future placement of gravel.

Again, it is with genuine thanks of your efforts to listen us as a people and to subsequently cancel the ITEK Workshop that we are writing. We are encouraged and are gaining our strength to continue our engagement positively from this point forward.

As a aside, it is also important for you to understand, not as an excuse but as an actuality of life in our community, we have had telecommunications outages over the last week otherwise we would have been able to send this to you sooner.

Dear Mr. Cohn and Ms. Boario,

Following our Cooperative Agency meeting in Kaktovik on February 13, 2023, our council has deliberated and have decided to send to you a letter of our concerns, outrage, and general frustration over your agency's action on what is being referred to as ITEK. We are extremely upset over the function of the ITEK Working Group and the agenda being presented in the ITEK Workshop scheduled to be held in Fairbanks, Alaska on February 22 through March 4. You have offered to come to Kaktovik following the ITEK Workshop to report back to us which we initially agreed to but we now feel that holding the ITEK Workshop is untenable to our community, its tribal members, and our culture. This workshop is a form of cultural appropriation of one culture against our culture and homelands which is being facilitated by both BLM, FWS and NARF.

Our trust relationship with the federal government is tenuous at best and is quickly being eroded by this action. This is moving so fast that we are having a difficult time keeping up which is counterproductive to any sort of relationship building – since our meeting – instead of slowing down the process you have had another ITEK Working Group

meeting, the meeting minutes were released on Friday, February 21, with a follow-up from NARF requesting that the meeting minutes be amended to stating "that the meeting needs to remain an "official NEPA meeting which is part of the record"" which implies the results of the Workshop become part of the public record. We strenuously oppose this request yet, as I prepare to send this to you, I have received a copy of the amended minutes adding that statement into the G2G record. We are unclear how the Workshop can be added to the NEPA record since it does not appear to be open to the public nor was it officially noticed in the Federal Register as a public workshop. These are our lands; we cannot let this Workshop become part of the public record – you are jeopardizing our identity – this is cultural assassination in a time that the agencies have been working to strengthen their relationships with us and it seems through the ITEK approach you are actively tearing them apart.

We are completely astonished that your agencies seem to think that the ITEK Workshop is something other than patronizing the Kaktovikmiut. The ITEK Workshop Agenda, the Working Group meeting minutes, and the fact that the attendees of the Working Group are mostly comprised of NARF and other special interest groups say it all and we cannot be complicit in allowing this process to continue which is to establish other tribe's footprint onto our homelands. There is nothing in the Workshop Agenda that even speaks to the purpose of correcting the 'legal deficiencies' of the Coastal Plain Oil and Gas Leasing EIS. We entered into a government-to-government relationship with you to address those issues and now, instead, we are fighting to retain our cultural identity. The fact that there is an ITEK Workshop scheduled with no thought of how the Kaktovikmiut can attend is more than outrageous - it is completely tone-deaf. The request that what information is received through the ITEK Workshop will become part of the public record is shameful because you are actively working to erase our culture in the process. Once the results of the Workshop are entered into the public record – remember anyone can say anything in this workshop and we believe most comments will be scripted by NARF - you have then, without any verification established other tribe's making representations about our region just by entering the Workshop into the public record 'as evidence'. We can't begin to express our outrage at all of this – either you as supposed 'unbiased agencies' are naïve about the narrative that is being constructed by this process or you are in collusion with the special interest groups and are passively allowing this to happen. So far, at every attempt we have made to address these issues your agencies have tried to placate our concerns – this has got to stop.

This email and the attached letter only begin to express the psychological and cultural damage this ITEK Workshop is doing to our tribal members. We feel the only way to begin to repair any trust and relationship with the federal government is to cancel the workshop and regroup.

Thank you for your attention to this most critical matter.

The BLM plans to gather 1,594 wild horses, remove approximately 1,381 excess wild horses, and treat up to 81 mares with a population suppression vaccine GonaCon and release them back to the range along with up to 121 stallions. Once gather operations are completed, approximately 612 wild horses will remain in the HMA and the HMA will be within the AML range

BLM-UT. Moab FO will approve a 24-month extension on the La Sal #2 APD requested by Wesco Operating, Inc. The APD has been the subject of a pending administrative appeal by adjacent landowners since 2020. Wesco Operating, Inc. has voluntarily elected to delay drilling operations pending resolution. The extension request is a variance from Onshore Oil and Gas Order 1 and is in accordance with extenuating circumstances outlined in BLM Instruction Memorandum 2023-011 Approved Application for Permit to Drill Extensions. Pending litigation,

BLM-ID. The Pocatello FO will release an EA for the proposed Burnstone Quarry for a 30-day draft review period. Burns Industries, LLC is requesting to develop the high-calcium limestone quarry with a total surface disturbance of approximately 262 acres, 204 acres of which are located on BLM-managed public lands. The BLM determined that the grade of the limestone proposed to be mined is suitable for chemical and metallurgical purposes, and is also suitable for making cement. It should therefore be processed as locatable under the mining laws. The anticipated life of the quarry is 100 years. Moderate controversy.

The lease application was submitted on March 10, 2009, to the BLM Utah State Office for 1,636.58 acres. The Decision Record and FONSI were signed Jan. 4, 2021, and the Fair Market Value report was signed on Oct. 3, 2023. This property is located in Uintah County between the applicant's private mining lands and additional federal leases. An operating plan and additional NEPA will be required before any surface disturbing activities are conducted per 43 CFR 3590.2(a). Low controversy

BLM-NM. The Carlsbad Field Office will approve an Application for Transportation and Utility Systems on Public Lands from Solaris Water Midstream, to construct, operate, maintain, and terminate water recycle facility and 1,832-foot-long access road. The Keg Shell project would disturb 9.99 acres of Federal surface. The proposed action falls within the proposed Carlsbad Chihuahuan Desert Rivers Area of Critical Environmental Concern. Mitigation measures will be incorporated into the conditions of approval to maintain the relevant and important criterion

It's the latest development in an eventful summer and fall for the Arctic, beginning with the administration's cancellation of all remaining oil and gas leases in the Arctic Refuge. Bureau of Land Management Concludes Public Comment Period on Expanding Protections for Arctic Refuge

**WASHINGTON**, D.C. -- Today, the Bureau of Land Management <u>concludes a public comment</u> <u>period</u> that could see additional protections for the Arctic Refuge.

The comment period focused on a <u>draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS)</u> affecting the Coastal Plain of Arctic Alaska, which the Biden Administration proposed in early September. An updated SEIS could bring much-needed protections to the Arctic Refuge, which is on the front line of the climate crisis. The coastal plain of Alaska is the biological heart of the Arctic Refuge, with lands and wildlife essential to sustaining Indigenous communities and cultures. It is one of the world's last intact ecosystems, and continued drilling would damage communities and exacerbate the climate crisis.

The end of the comment period is the latest development in a flurry of administrative action in the Arctic. In September, Interior Secretary Deb Haaland canceled all remaining oil and gas leases in the Arctic Refuge. An additional comment period on proposed new environmental protections in the Western Arctic is set to conclude on November 17. In all, more than 21 million acres, an area nearly as large as Indiana, could see additional protections for public lands and waters.

In response, Athan Manuel, director of Sierra Club's Lands Protection Program, released the following statements:

"It is clear that oil and gas drilling is not compatible with the long-term survival of the Arctic and the communities and wildlife that rely on it. The Arctic is on the front lines of the climate crisis. Establishing additional protections and ending new oil and gas leasing could make it the front line of climate action. We will continue to urge the Biden Administration to listen to the Gwich'in Nation, take bold action to protect public lands and waters and avert climate catastrophe." 

Rising U.S. Transportation Fuel Prices

After coming off their twenty-year (non-inflation-adjusted) peaks in the late summer of 2022, U.S. transportation fuel prices are rising aggressively. President's Biden Administration helped ease the increase in 2022 through a 600 million barrel drawdown of the U.S. Strategic Petroleum Reserve (SPR). Nevertheless, OPEC+ members have been increasingly curtailing crude oil supplies in order to bolster global oil benchmark prices leading to higher fuel prices. In addition, the President's administration is attempting to curtail future U.S. oil and gas production through the cancellation of leases on federal

lands such as Alaska's ANWR (the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge).

U.S. August inflation as reported Thursday, September 14, 2023 by the

Bureau of Labor Statistics showed transportation fuel price increases as the most prominent factor contributing to August's CPI (Consumer Price Index) rise.

In reaction, the Subcommittee on Economic Growth, Energy Policy, and Regulatory Affairs of the U.S. House Oversight Committee has <u>scheduled</u> <u>a hearing for 2pm Tuesday September 19, 2023</u> to examine rising fuel prices and their contribution to inflation.

Relatedly, Larry Goldstein, EPRINC's President Emeritus has published "<u>The Cluttered Table</u>" on approaches the President's Administrations might take.

## Biden-Harris Administration Takes Major Steps to Protect Arctic Lands and Wildlife in Alaska

Department of the Interior cancels oil and gas leases in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge; proposes new protections in National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska

**WASHINGTON** — The Biden-Harris administration today announced significant steps to protect the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge (Arctic Refuge) and more than 13 million acres in the National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska (NPR-A). These bold actions to protect the Arctic region build on President Biden's <u>historic conservation and climate agenda</u>, which already includes protecting more than 21 million acres of public lands and waters across the nation, and securing the Inflation Reduction Act, the largest investment in climate action in history.

In the Arctic Refuge, Secretary of the Interior Deb Haaland has authorized the cancellation of the remaining seven oil and gas leases issued by the previous administration in the Coastal Plain. The leases were suspended in June 2021 following the issuance of <a href="Secretary's Order (S.O.) 3401">Secretary's Order (S.O.) 3401</a>, which identified "multiple legal deficiencies in the underlying record supporting the leases."

In addition, the Department today <u>proposed new regulations</u> for the NPR-A that would ensure maximum protection for the more than 13 million acres of Special Areas in the reserve, while supporting subsistence activities for Alaska Native communities. The proposed rule, <u>previewed in March 2023</u>, adds to President Biden's actions to protect millions of acres of lands and waters in the Arctic, including withdrawing approximately 2.8 million acres of the Beaufort Sea, ensuring the entire United States Arctic Ocean is off limits to new oil and gas leasing.

"With climate change warming the Arctic more than twice as fast as the rest of the planet, we must do everything within our control to meet the highest standards of care to protect this fragile ecosystem," said **Secretary Haaland**. "President Biden is delivering on the most ambitious climate and conservation agenda in history. The steps we are taking today further that commitment, based on the best available science and in recognition of the Indigenous Knowledge of the original stewards of this area, to safeguard our public lands for future generations."

#### Lease Cancellations in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge

Following passage of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 (Tax Act), the previous Administration held an oil and gas lease sale in the Arctic Refuge's Coastal Plain on January 6, 2021, and issued 10-year leases on nine tracts covering more than 430,000 acres. On January 21, 2021, President Biden issued Executive Order 13990, directing the Department to review oil and gas leasing in the Refuge, "[i]n light of the alleged legal deficiencies underlying the program." S.O. 3401 directed a new, comprehensive analysis of the potential environmental impacts of the Coastal Plain Leasing Program. Since that time, two of the issued leases have been canceled and refunded at the request of the lessees. The remaining seven leases held by the sole lessee covered 365,000 acres in the Coastal Plain.

The Secretary of the Interior has the authority to cancel or suspend oil and gas leases issued in violation of a statute or regulation. The draft supplemental environmental impact statement (SEIS) released today by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) developed information supporting the Department's determination that the 2021 lease sale was seriously flawed and based on a number of fundamental legal deficiencies, including: insufficient analysis under the National Environmental Policy Act, including failure to adequately analyze a reasonable range of alternatives and properly quantify downstream greenhouse gas emissions; and failure to properly interpret the Tax Act. Accordingly, Secretary Haaland has determined that the leases issued by the previous administration in the Arctic Refuge shall be cancelled.

#### Protections in the National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska

Extending from the northwest slope of the Brooks Range to the Arctic Coast, the NPR-A encompasses roughly 23 million acres of public land managed by the BLM. Tribal Nations have occupied lands now within the NPR-A since time immemorial, and over 40 Indigenous communities continue to rely on subsistence activities in the reserve, harvesting caribou, shore and waterbirds, and many other fish and wildlife species, with many communities subsisting primarily from food harvested from the NPR-A.

Under the Naval Petroleum Reserves Production Act (NPRPA) of 1976, Congress directed the BLM to balance oil and gas development with the management and protection of sensitive landscapes – known as Special Areas – and surface resources across the reserve. The proposed rule is designed to assure maximum protection of Special Areas, as authorized under the NPRPA. The proposed rule would require that protections for Special Areas remain in place for as long as the values and characteristics in those areas are present, ensuring the durability of the protections into the future. The proposed rule also would require the BLM to review and gather public input – at least every five years – on whether existing special areas should be expanded, whether new special areas should be designated, and whether additional resources within special areas should be identified for protection. Upon finalization of the proposed rule, the Administration will follow this proposed process to inform the creation or expansion of additional special areas in the NPR-A.

The proposed rule would protect 13 million acres encompassed by the existing Special Areas by limiting future oil and gas leasing and industrial development in the Teshekpuk Lake, Utukok Uplands, Colville River, Kasegaluk Lagoon, and Peard Bay Special Areas – places collectively known for their globally significant intact habitat for wildlife, including grizzly and polar bears, caribou and hundreds of thousands of migratory birds. The rule would establish an outright prohibition on any new leasing in 10.6 million acres, more than 40 percent of the NPR-A.

The proposed rule would raise the bar for development throughout the NPR-A by establishing clear guidelines that are consistent with provisions of the current management plan for the reserve, the NPR-A Integrated Activity Plan (IAP). This current management plan for the reserve was put in place in 2022, and effectively reversed the previous administration's IAP that sought to expand oil and gas leasing and development in the NPR-A and reduce protections for the Special Areas.

The proposed rulemaking would help protect subsistence uses throughout the NPR-A, responding to Alaska Native communities who have relied on the land, water and wildlife to support their way of life for thousands of years. It also advances the Biden-Harris administration's commitment to strengthening the role of Tribal governments in the management of public lands by encouraging the BLM to explore co-stewardship opportunities with Tribes for the Special Areas.

#### Seeking Public Comment


There will be a 45-day public review and comment period on the draft SEIS for the Coastal Plain. In developing the draft, the BLM and FWS engaged with a wide variety of stakeholders and used the best available data and science, including Indigenous Knowledge. The proposed NPR-A rule and map of the five NPR-A Special Areas as delineated in the 2022 IAP, are available for preview. A forthcoming publication of the proposed rule in the Federal Register will open a 60-day public comment period. During that time, the BLM will host in-person meetings in communities on the North Slope, as well as virtual public meetings to discuss the proposed rule. Details of those opportunities will be made available soon.
